
C7G Season Opens with "Grease


"Grease," written by Jim Jacobs and Warren Casey, first opened in February 1972 at the Eden Theatre in New York and was nominated for 7 Tony awards. It replaced "Fiddler On The Roof" as the longest running show on Broadway with its 3,243rd perform-

This ambitious undertaking at the CTG is directed by **Ingrid Boydston** who states, "This show has the highest production value of anything I've ever seen at this theatre!"

Adventures In Theatre

The Canyon Theatre Guild's successful daytime theatre program, Adventures In Theatre, is back for its fourth year! This program is structured for home schooled children, part-time students, and adults who are available during the day to participate in a performance-based workshop.

The Fall Semester's production will be a musical version of "The Wind In The Willows." Auditions for this workshop will be held on Wednesday and Thursday, Sept. 1st and 2nd, from 11:00 am until 2:00 pm. For information or to schedule an audition appointment, contact Patti Finley, the Director of Daytime Programs, at 254-0064. Jennifer Rennels-Magon will be Assistant Director of the program.

The Spring Semester production will be Roald Dahl's "James And The Giant Peach." Watch for audition information on this program in the November/December edition of this newsletter.

The fee for this ten-week workshop is \$129 per student, with family discounts available. Some scholarships are also available. The workshop will culminate in two weeks of daytime performances for our local elementary school children in Mid-November.

ACT III After School Workshop

The popular After School Workshop, ACT III, will hold <u>auditions for the Fall Semester</u> on Wednesday and Thursday, Sept. 1st and 2nd from 4:00-6:00 pm. This performance-based workshop will present the musical,

"Schoolhouse Rock, Junior," and is open to all Junior High and High School students. The instructional team includes **Patti Finley**, Director; **Michael Davies**, Assistant Director; **Leslie Berra**, Vocal Director; and **Musette Caing**, Choreographer.

Call Patti Finley at 254-0064 to schedule an audition appointment or for additional information. Students should come to the audition prepared to sing, read from the script, and learn a dance combination. Students should bring their own musical accompaniment track for their vocal audition. A karaoke track would be great and may be either a CD or tape. There should not be any other voices on the track (some backup voices would be okay).

This workshop will meet Monday through Thursday from 4:00 – 6:00 pm for ten weeks with four performances scheduled at the end of the workshop period. The exact performance dates will be scheduled around the CTG's holiday production and will be announced later.

The fee for this workshop is being underwritten from the funds raised at last year's Holipalooza!, so students will only have to pay a materials fee. You won't want to miss being a part of this wonderful experience.

Stars for Students

The Stars for Students are up!! This very special constellation is located on house left as you enter the theatre from the top of the stairs. Especially sought are group numbers, production numbers, and dance numbers. A group may have a featured soloist, but the committee is not looking for solo numbers. So put a group together and let us see what you have in mind. Auditions do not have to be performance ready, but should be polished enough to give a good idea of what the number will look like. If you do audition as a solo, please understand that the committee reserves the right to put you in a duet or a group number.

We are striving for the most impressive production numbers we can have, using larger groups of performers, in order to show the Guild off in its best light. It will be a night to shine as a member of a polished ensemble. In order to accomplish this, you must be available for group rehearsals.
