The Heartwarming Holiday Tale of Ebenezer Scrooge is presented at the CTG



Famous the world over, the ghostly but ultimately heart-warming story of Ebenezer Scrooge and the change of heart he undergoes towards Mankind is known around the globe. The Canyon Theatre Guild's presentation of this classic holiday tale will delight families for an evening of theatre that will ignite the holiday spirit.

Families the world over have been touched by Ebenezer Scrooge's realization that the frailty of time and of life heavily outweighs the mere jingle of coin. Dickens' charming story, mingled with carolers and just a piece of magic, renders the CTG's 2005 production of "A Christmas Carol" appropriate for even the littlest sugar-plum dreamer.

Under the direction of Greg and Patti Finley, with assistance by Jim Robinson, the glowing cast includes Michael Davies appearing as Scrooge. The three ghostly spirits who visit him are Jeannie Jones Johnson as the Ghost of Christmas Past, Randy Aronson as the Ghost of Christmas Present, and Carol Rock (who also serves as Stage Manager) as the Ghost of Christmas Yet-to-Come. Marley's ghost is eerily portrayed by CTG newcomer, Jerry Wind. Jason Endicott and Jill Kocalis Pappas are Bob Cratchit and wife, and Cameron Kelly, Ashley Pfenning, Kaylin Mahoney, Bree Saylor and Kamber Moen are the Cratchit children, with Liam Johnson as Tiny Tim. Nephew Fred is



portrayed by Lou Steele, Kristen Hansen is his wife, Vicki Lightner is her sister, and Jeremy Wind plays Topper. Scrooge as a boy is played by Elijah Veluzat; Scrooge as a young man is Matthew Smith, and Belle, Scrooge's young love, is Kelly Nicole.

Bring your whole family to this enchanting presentation of this timeless story. Ensemble members include Jeff Johnson and Tamara Ashton as Mr. and Mrs. Fezziwig, with Emily Chetner, Emily Krogh and Francesca Riso as their daughters; Frank Rock and Tom Boldt as the Businessmen; Jean Paletz and Steve Krogh as two of Scrooge's debtors; Colin Robert, Max Jacobson, and Dante Belardinelli play voung Scrooge's school chums: Kendall Myler is Fan, Scrooge's older sister; the young Businessmen/Fezziwig suitors are Joshua Smith, Tim Kendall, and Kyle Stone. Others in the cast are Cambria Jenkins, Dylan Belardinelli, Harold Kruger, and Leah Kari. The Carolers are Tamarah Ashton, Jill Kocalis Pappas, Jean Paletz, Francesca Riso, Lou Steele, Garrett Finley, Tom Lund, and Steve Krogh.

The design team bringing this tale of old to life includes Jim Robinson, Jeff Hyde, and Frank Rock as set designers, Marc Steinfeld and Loren Burghout as lighting designers, and Jill McGlynn and Flo Loring as costume designers. Vocal direction will be shared by Tamarah Ashton and Garrett Finley; choreography of the Fezziwig dance is by Musette Caing.

This holiday production opens Thanksgiving weekend, with a champagne reception opening night on Friday, November 25. There will be 8:00 pm performances each Friday and Saturday evening through December 22. Saturday and Sunday matinees are at 2:00 pm each weekend and Sunday evenings at 6:30 pm on December 11 and 18. There are additional weeknight performances at 7:00 pm on December 15, 20, 21, and 22. Ticket prices are \$10/\$13 for Juniors/Seniors and \$13/\$17 for Adults. 
