Ralphie Parker wants only one thing under his tree: A genuine, authentic, Red Ryder Air Rifle, with a compass and this thing that tells time built right into the stock. But every time he tells someone about it, their response is, "You'll shoot your eye out!"


Humorist Jean Shepherd's memories of his boyhood, chronicled in his book In God We Trust, All Others Pay Cash were the basis for the popular motion picture, A Christmas Story, which has become a holiday classic. Now, as a stage production, A Christmas Story is coming to the Canyon Theatre Guild's Newhall Playhouse for the holiday season with a champagne opening night on Friday, November 23RD.

In his quest for a genuine Red Red Ryder BB gun, Ralphie (Ross Mayer) pleads his case before his mother (Amy Prieto), his teacher (Leah Kari) and even Santa Claus himself, at Goldblatt's Department Store. Their response? "You'll shoot your eye out!" As Ralphie fantasizes about the ways in which a BB gun could save his family's life from a gang of desperados, or a rabid raccoon, or on a jungle safari, his "Old Man" (Marc Deagon) spends his spare time fantasizing about the Christmas turkey and about winning one of the numerous contests he enters. He eventually does win a "major award" - a lamp shaped like a woman's leg in fishnet hose! You'll meet Ralphie's best friends, Flick (Jacob Viramontes) and Schwartz (Jeffrey McKim), the town bully, Scut Farkas (Sean Kelly), Ralphie's little brother, Randy (Tyler Allen), and Esther Jane (Ashley Pfenning) who has a crush on young Ralphie. The story is told by Ralph as an adult (Randy Aronson) looking back on his childhood which

also includes memories of his other school chums played by Kyra Weaver, Alexandra Aaron, Halle Kortlander, JT Friedman, Curtis Crawford, and Jack Gillespie.

Under the direction of Greg and Patti Finley, A Christmas Story will be great fun for the whole family. Jim Robinson is Assistant Director and Set Designer, Nanook is designing the sound, Tim Christianson is lighting designer, and Jill McGlynn is designing the

period costumes. Carol Rock will be the Stage Manager. The limited run begins on November 23RD through December 22ND, with performances every Friday and Saturday evening at 8рм, Saturday and Sunday matinees at 1PM, and week-night performances at 7PM on December 18, 19, and 20. Youth Workshop Updates

The Fall semester has ended and we are very proud of the 80+ children who participated in the four workshops. Special thanks to our terrific instructors for their hard work and their dedication to teaching the children the art of live theatre.

Adventures in Theatre, Act I presented a delightful production of an original adaptation of *Thumbelina* written by Wade Bradford. Congratulations to instructors Laura Lanoil and Jean Paletz for their wonderful work with this group of home-schooled children. Jean also designed the set and costumes, and Neil Fleisher wrote the original music.

Adventures in Theatre, Act II just completed two weeks of performances of a musical adaptation of *Stuart Little*. Nearly 2,000 local elementary school children enjoyed this production and we appreciate the support of their teachers and of all the parents who shared their home-schooled chil-

dren with us for 12 weeks! Patti Finley and Laura Lanoil were the directors, Rebecca Coombs did the choreography, and Valerie Gould was assistant instructor. Jill McGlynn designed the clever costumes, Michael Davies designed the set, Kimberlee Lucas was prop mistress, and George Cummings did the sound design.

ACT III After School Workshop under the direction of Michael Davies ("Sir Dude") presented the musical *Twinderella*, the Cinderella story with a "twist." This class was filled to overflowing and we thank Mike and his assistant Jean Paletz for sharing their love of musical theatre with these children. Jean also designed the costumes, and Mike designed the set.

ACT IV After School Workshop for children in 6TH through 11TH grade presented an original revue, *Once Upon A Musical*, written and directed by Patti Finley (with input from the students), which traced 100 years of musical theatre. Michael Davies was assistant director, Laurie Morgan directed the vocals, and Musette Caing created the choreography.

All of these children worked hard, learned a lot and had fun making new friends. We hope to see them back for another workshop very soon! Thanks again to our instructors, without whom we could not offer these programs.

Although from this past summer to the fall she faded from plaid to gray, the focus of this month's spotlight is on a key player in the Guild who makes everyone on stage look good – costumer Janet McAnany. Since the fall of 2004, Janet has worked as a lead costumer or helped on several of CTG's productions, and won a Goldie award for Costumes (with Jill McGlynn) for Oklahoma! in 2006.

And finally, this event could not have happened without the many wonderful Gala volunteers who donated their time and talents. Putting on an event of this size required countless volunteers to serve as waiters or bartenders, to solicit auction donations, and to help with set-up, check-in, checkout, and many other tasks. This event was a success because of you!

Janet was first introduced to CTG when her son played *Rumpelstiltskin* in a Children's workshop "up the Canyon" at the old Sierra Highway theatre. In 2004, member **Susan Pearsall**, who Janet knew through work, introduced her to **Jill McGlynn**, and Janet sewed her first CTG costumes for *Pom Pom Zombies*. In addition to work on several shows, Janet has appeared on stage as a costumer in *Bye Bye Birdie*, and as a nurse in *Dracula: The Case of the Silver Scream*.

Costuming highlights for Janet have come in her most recent shows this summer's Forever Plaid and the just finished Dracula. "I particularly enjoyed the challenge of Dracula making the costumes work with the makeup and lighting in the black and white setting. I think the moment I've enjoyed most at CTG, though, was the reaction of the audiences when the Forever Plaid characters appeared at the end of the show in their plaid jackets. The audience reaction, which I watched from the back of the theatre, really took my breath away." The jackets, custom-tailored by Janet, are now a popular rental item for other theatre groups.

She works as a librarian (with CTG regular Kathi Lund) at Santa Clarita Elementary. Janet teaches sewing in the afterschool enrichment program there, so she's also helping create costuming talent for the future.
