When asked the secret to his success, legendary crooner Frank Sinatra said, “Sing good songs.” Those “good songs” are now at the Canyon Theatre Guild in the swinging musical tribute, *My Way*. Come listen to your favorite melodies as fashioned by one of the great entertainers of all time, and maybe even experience some numbers you may not have heard before. Laugh at the witty repartee and at times outright silliness in life. The CTG’s stage will be filled with song, dance, a live band, and fun facts about this beloved performer.

Today’s audiences measure new crooners by the standard set by the master. Impersonation may be the highest form of flattery, but only Ol’ Blue Eyes is Frank Sinatra. When David Grapes and Todd Olson began their project centered on Frank’s career they created not another impersonation. Rather they arranged a musical tribute in four-part harmony to the man whose melodies “created eras.” Big band, a laid back beat, and a smooth baritone voice are only a couple of elements that make up the iconic performer. With the numerous appearances in musical halls, television, movies, and social gatherings around the country, not to mention recording over 1,300 songs, Frank taught us how to live life and enjoy every moment of it.

The nightclub setting and live music recreate the iconic age dominated by Frank Sinatra. The tight harmonies and variety of dancing has given new life to these classic songs. When they are not singing one of the 56 songs arranged in medleys, the banter between players is light hearted and fun. The actors compliment each other in a way that demonstrates how Frank’s music transcends generations.
